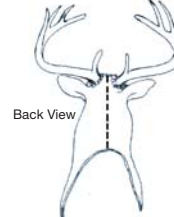

How to skin your trophies

NEVER CUT THE THROAT!

There are three basic cuts needed to cape out any animal. They are...

First Cut



Back View

First Cut At the back of the skull, where it joins the neck, push your knife through the skin, cutting the skin out.

Proceed down the center of the back of the neck, down the center of the back to about the 4th or 5th rib.

Second Cut Once again, cutting from the skin out, cut completely around the animal.

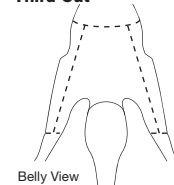
Side View

Third Cut Again, cutting from the skin out, take the front legs and cut around the leg just above the knee joint. Proceed to skin up the back side of the leg, along the rib cage, to your second cut. Do both legs in this manner.

Then proceed to gently pull the skin forward, using your knife only when needed to free the hide from the meat. If the animal is fresh, the hide will easily pull away with little knife work involved. Once the entire cape is pulled forward to the start of the first cut, take a bone saw and cut through the neck bone and detach the skull from the rest of the body.

We recommend that you refrigerate/freeze the head/cape, then bring it to **The Flagg Group** to finish skinning out the head.

The best way to preserve a cape/skin is by removing all the flesh and freezing or salting. In salting, use plenty of fine table salt - not rock salt. It's best to salt heavily, let stand overnight, spread out, then resalt. Do not place skins in plastic bags because of heat retention and lack of ventilation.

Skinning for Rugs Start the incision 2 inches from the tip of the chin and cut down the throat and breast to end of tail, and from inside of feet down inside of legs to center of cut. Leaves claws on skin. Clean skins of all flesh and fat, salt heavily, roll up and let lay for a few hours. Stretch out well and dry in the shade, as the sun will burn them.

Skinning for Lifesize Mounting Cut the skin open by a clean straight cut in the middle-line of the undersurface of the body. Split the legs open so the cut will be out of sight as much as possible when the animal is mounted.

Leave scalps and hooves/paws attached to the hide. Take measurements of the body. Clean hide of all flesh, and salt heavily. For skinning the head and care of the hide, see instructions above.

Don't skin animals like squirrels, mink, etc. Please freeze whole!

Birds & Fish Place in plastic bag and freeze as soon as possible. Do not gut or field-dress!

Shipping your trophies When shipping your trophies, make sure they are properly preserved and packaged, and that the shipment is made prepaid. Freeze the specimen in dry ice and mark the package RUSH - PERISHABLE. Put our telephone number (214-350-2551) on both the package and waybill so we will be notified immediately upon its arrival. Ship by bus or air freight. Be sure to time your shipment to arrive during our working hours of 8 am to 5 pm on weekdays, not weekends. Be sure to enclose your complete name, address, telephone number and specific instructions in order to avoid or minimize errors, mix-ups or delays.
